Biography

David Kenny received his doctorate in Psychology from Northwestern University, 1972. Among his many achievements, Dr. Kenny received the University of Connecticut's Board of Trustees' Distinguished Professor Award in 2002, the Alumni Distinguished Professor Award in 2006, the Donald Campbell Award from Society for Personality and Social Psychology in 2006, and is included in <http://www.ISIHighlyCited.com>. He teaches Social Psychology at the undergraduate level and Causal Modeling in Social Psychology, Field Methods in Social Psychology, and Interpersonal Perception at the graduate level. As a social psychologist, he is interested in social interaction in general and interpersonal perception in particular. He is the author of six books, the most recent being *Dyadic Data Analysis*.

Current Research Interests

In addition to his interest in social interaction and interpersonal perception, Dr. Kenny has also worked in the analysis of experimental and non-experimental data. He has worked in the areas of structural equation modeling, longitudinal data analysis, and program evaluation. He has focused on how design decisions affect statistical analysis and on the issue of multiple levels of analysis.
